Succeeded in having the agency create a special project for this purpose and to devote a full time staff member to head the project. 1979 California, Governor Was consulted by Tony Kline, the Governor's Legal Affairs Secretary, on the wording of an executive order prohibiting sexual orientation discrimination in state employment. Jerry Brown signed the order on April 4, 1979. 1979 California, Department of Fair Employment and Housing Worked with a small group of colleagues to convince Joanne Lewis, Director of the Department, to reverse a prior directive which precluded the agency from processing complaints of sexual orientation discrimination in housing. The agency then began to provide protection to victims of such discrimination. 1976 California, Governor Worked with a small group of colleagues to convince Carlotta Melon, the Governor's Appointments Secretary, to screen potential appointees for
